



Luxury Design Studio and Construction Firm Collaborate in Street Art Project in Notting Hill.

London, UK - Studio Indigo and London Projects showcase a new hand-painted mural by Royal Collage of Art alumni, Adalberto Lonardi, on their construction site in Lansdowne Road, for the public art initiative by Kensington and Chelsea Art Week.

The street art, which was completed on the 15th February, is the fifth mural in the Love Kensington + Chelsea Street Art project. The public art initiative celebrates the histories of the Borough with murals by local artists on construction hoardings and chosen by public vote. The project creates temporary landmarks to identify the area geographically for residents, businesses and visitors to increase a sense of civic pride; to strengthen connection across the community.

“Together as One” by artist Adalberto Lonardi was chosen after three designs were shortlisted and were put to a public vote which received over 1200 votes. The unique design was inspired by the research of the local history and engagement with Studio Indigo, the architects behind the building’s restoration and renovation. The winning design was equally inspired by Studio Indigo’s architectural influence of the Indian practice of Vaastu and the local culture and heritage.

Tyche McCaig, Director at Studio Indigo, said: *“We are delighted to be a part of this cultural celebration showcasing the borough’s talented artists and rich heritage through KCAW’s art initiative”*

Steve Howat, Managing Director of London Projects, describes how *“We have had some very encouraging feedback from the community during the production of this piece and it has provided some much-needed positivity during what is a difficult time.”*

The 22m mural represents three stories in time. The first panel depicts a time when pottery making and farming brought together the rural Knottyngull village in medieval times. The second panel represents an early Portobello Market where the relationships between fruit and vegetable vendors and customers were vital to energise the life of the Borough’s streets. The third panel shows the intimate moment of a family preparing for Carnival inside a recently renovated Georgian house. Artist Adalberto Lonardi says: *“I believe we need to reconnect with one another and live again together as one. We have to reconnect with our history, traditions and the people who shaped us. As artists, citizens and human beings we must celebrate the essential things of life”*

The mural will be on display until May 2021.
